<p>Practise reading the green words. If you can read the words with set 1 sounds try to read the set 2 words.</p>	<p>Find some objects (no more than 20) record how many you have on the one more/one less sheet. Can you find one more and one less by adding or taking away one? Can you record this on your sheet?</p>	<p>Can you design your own pancake? You can use the sheet to cut and stick the different ingredients.</p>
<p>Practice counting from 1 to 20.</p>		<p>Can you learn the pancake song? (It is sung to the tune of the Wheels on the Bus). https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=erKlrk1Y8P0</p>
<p>Practise writing your numbers to 20 using the number rhymes to help you.</p>	<p>Use the dinosaur sheet to find one more and one less. You could cross a dinosaur out to help you find one less and you could draw another dinosaur to find one more.</p>	
<p>Sing some of your favourite nursery rhymes and songs.</p>	<p>Can you complete the missing numbers on the one more/one less lorry sheet? See if you can use the number line to help you. If you're finding that tricky you can use objects to work out the answers.</p>	<h2>Online</h2>
<p>Practise reading the red words – remember, these can't be sounded out. You just need to learn them.</p>		<p>Explore the activities on Phonics Play. https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk Select the 'resources' tab, then 'phase 2'.</p>

<p>Try and learn the red words. Use the sheet to help you write them.</p>	<p>Can you draw a picture of your own troll? Think about the different features. Will he/she have long hair? A big nose? Warts? Three toes? Try and label the different parts using some describing words.</p>	<p>Play Phonics Pop! https://www.ictgames.com/phonicsPop/ Select the sounds you want to practise, listen for the game to say them and keep an eye out for them on the screen. Try to pop as many as you can.</p>
<p>Learn our description of a troll.</p>		<p>Purple Mash- can you paint a picture of a troll?</p>

Can you describe what the troll was like?</p>	<p>Can you write some simple sentences to describe your troll? You could start each sentence with he/she has... Remember the words don't necessarily need to be spelt correctly, just use your sounds and Fred fingers to work them out. You can use this video to support with writing- https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=5A8fIOVAF7I Try and use finger spaces between each word.</p>	<p>Purple Mash- can you retell the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff? Can you write words/captions for each picture?</p>
