<p><u>Times tables</u> Practise your tables (including your division facts). Use online games such as 'Hit The Button'. You can find this game on the 'Topmarks' website plus many more! https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hitthe-button 2x, 4x and 5x table speed sheets.</p>	<p><u>Writing a List</u> Listen to the reading of "My Uncle is a Hunkle" by Lauren Child on Youtube. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Q7ez-9Yuc_A&feature=youtu.be Write a list of all the things that went wrong when Uncle Ted came to babysit. Then - look at the checklist - how many did you remember? Did you get them in the right order? Disasters Checklist.</p>	<p><u>Character Profile</u> Choose your favourite character from the story. Write all about that person. Use really good adjectives and adverbs to describe the people, animals and objects in your writing. Make sure all your sentences are correctly punctuated, with initial capital letters and full stops. Draw a picture of your character in the style of Lauren Child.Character Profile.</p>	<p><u>Word Problems</u> "Jo's doll is 20cm tall. Sue's doll is 10cm taller. How tall is Sue's doll?" Ask a grown up to set you a maths problem. Draw a picture to help you think about the problem. Decide what operation you need - +, -, x or ÷ Then work out the answer! Word Problems, pages 5,6.</p>
<p><u>Spelling</u> Practise spelling Common Exception Words. Make up a sentence containing this word. Check - does it make sense? Have I used a capital letter and a full stop or question mark? Common Exception Words 1</p>	<p><u>Write about a disaster - Conjunctions</u> Select one event from the list of disasters that you thought really funny. Write sentences about what happened at this point in the story in as much detail as you can. Try to use conjunctions to join together ideas in your sentences. Add a drawing. Conjunctions Examples.</p>	<p><u>Family Profiles</u> Make up some character profiles for the people in your family. Draw a picture and describe them. Whose family is funnier? Yours or Clarice Bear's? My Family Profiles.</p>	<p><u>Symmetry</u>  The butterfly is symmetrical. If we draw a line or fold down the middle, both sides are the same shape. Try folding some 2D shapes in half. Which ones are symmetrical? Geometry, page 13</p>
<p><u>Handwriting</u> Practise your joined handwriting. Use Handwriting, Number 3, Sheet 1 and 2.</p>	<p><u>The day we had a disaster!</u> Draw and write about a (possibly babysitter-related) disaster that happened to you or your family. If you prefer, make up a story about a funny disaster happening at your house.</p>	<p><u>Count backwards</u> Close your eyes. Can you count backwards in 2s from 20? Can you count backwards in 5s from 50? Ask a friend to check while you count. Numbers, pages 54,55.</p>	<p><u>Pattern</u> Can you continue the pattern?  What is the rule? Ask a friend to make up some patterns for you to continue. What if the rule is in the middle? Can you continue the pattern both ways? Geometry, page 32,33,34.</p>
<p><u>Reading</u> Do some reading every day. When you finish a book, write a book review. Book Review, Number 3.</p>	<p><u>Nouns, adjectives, adverbs</u> Listen again to "My Uncle is a Hunkle," Look at Clarice's Mum. Read the description of Clarice's Mum. Follow the instructions and use different coloured pens to highlight all the nouns, adjectives and adverbs you can find. Check with the Answers sheet to see how well you did! Clarice's Mum.</p>	<p><u>Odd and Even Numbers</u> Work out whether a number is odd or even by dividing that number by 2. Use items for counting (such as pasta shapes, lego etc) and share those items between 2 sharing circles. Numbers, pages 57,58.</p>	<p><u>Multiplying by 2,5,10</u> I have 4 bunches of bananas. Each bunch has 5 bananas. How many bananas altogether? Ask an adult to set you more problems like this. Operations, pages 102,103.</p>
