<p><u>English</u> Write the story of Scarlett Beane. Use the story map you made last week to help you remember the main events. Don't forget to post on Seesaw .</p>	<p><u>English</u> Play similes matching pairs game. Ideally you need to print these and cut them up to make cards. Take a photo of you playing the game. If it is difficult to do this you could make a book, showing some of the similes from the game and the Scarlett Beane story e.g. as red as a beetroot. (See attached)</p>	<p><u>English</u> Read the story of Scarlett Beane with your family on the attached document. You could film a couple of pages of this for Seesaw. (See attached)</p>	<p><u>English</u> Look at the story you wrote of Scarlett Beane. See if you can improve it, add more adjectives or an extra simile. Correct full stops and capital letters.</p>
<p><u>Purple Mash - Games</u> Visit the garden centre, spend time planting seeds and watching them grow! (See 2 dos).</p>	<p><u>Purple Mash - English</u> Practise spelling words with 'ie' 'ea' and 'oy.' (See 2 dos)</p>	<p><u>Purple Mash - English</u> Practise spelling words with the 'aw' and 'ew' sounds. (See 2 dos)</p>	<p><u>Phonics</u> https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/4/tricky-word-trucks Play 'Tricky word Trucks.' Select the level that is right for you. You can log in for free with the username and password on the PhonicsPlay website.</p>
<p><u>Maths</u> Weight game: https://uk.splashlearn.com/measurement-games Look at the fruit and vegetable items on the weighing balances, choose the heavier item, how do you know? Use words like heavy, heaviest compare, not equal, weight... Draw and label some of the items that were heavier on the special paper. (see attached)</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Choose a range of real life food items e.g. packets, tins, fruit or vegetables. If possible weigh these on kitchen scales, or look at the quantities on the packets. Write the weights in grams/kilograms in a list. Upload photos of you weighing your items onto Seesaw.</p>	<p><u>Purple Mash - Maths</u> Weight/height/length quiz choosing correct measuring word for picture scenarios (See 2 dos)</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/mostlyPostie/index.html Select the 'answers in steps of 10g' option. Drag the parcels onto the scales. Read the scales to find the mass of the object.</p>
<p><u>Science</u> Make a shopping list of vegetables. Ask your family members which are their favourites, or maybe ones they would like to try out. (See attached)</p>	<p><u>Purple Mash - Science</u> Pet captions- choose your favourite pet or a pet you might like and write about them. Give as much information about the animal including what they eat, how they move and describe their features. (See 2 dos)</p>	<p><u>Art</u> Paint or build a model of the castle of vegetables from the story of Scarlett Beane. See how many different vegetables you can include e.g. carrots, onions and parsley... Upload a video/photo on Seesaw.</p>	<p><u>World Book Day-</u> Think of your favourite book character. You might like to dress up as that character. Take a photo for Seesaw if you do! Then write some clues for this character to see if your teacher can guess who you have chosen. For example if it was Peter Rabbit your clues might be: Scared of angry farmers. Has a blue jacket. Loves to eat vegetables. Is very brave.</p>
