

## Learning@Home Grid 7 Red Room

<p><u>Monday English</u> Tune into our school YouTube channel and listen to Mrs Willis telling the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff. <b>STARS</b> - Tell an adult which is your favourite part of the story and why. <b>GEMS</b> - Complete the Book Review sheet.</p>	<p><u>Tuesday English</u> <b>STARS</b> and <b>GEMS</b> Use the Story Map in Resources to make a story map of The Three Billy Goats Gruff Story. Think about what happened first, next, after that, then and finally.</p>	<p><u>Wednesday English</u> <b>STARS</b> - Use your story map to help you. Choose your favourite character in the story. Act out what happens to them. What do you think they would say? <b>GEMS</b> - Do the same as Stars. Write down 3 sentences saying what you think your character would say in different parts of the story.</p>	<p><u>Thursday English</u> <b>STARS</b> - Find the Billy Goats Gruff word colouring sheet. Colour carefully. Have a go at writing the words. <b>GEMS</b> - Write out the answer these questions using sentences. Why did the goats want to get over the bridge? What did the little goat say to the troll? Why do you think the troll lived under the bridge? What do you think happened to the troll after the story ended?</p>
<p><u>Monday Maths</u> <b>STARS</b> Use the number cards for Monday's Maths lesson for Stars to make a number line. Cut them out carefully. Challenge: Make your own set of 0-10 number cards. <b>GEMS</b> Odd and even numbers. 0 2 4 6 8 = even 1 3 5 7 9 = odd Log onto Purple Mash. Type odd and even into the Search box. Select the folder with the racing car. Play the 0-20 game first. Challenge yourself and play the 0-100 game, sort the numbers thinking if they are odd or even.</p>	<p><u>Tuesday Maths</u> <b>STARS</b> Ask an adult to help you cut out the coloured circles. Match them on top of the other numbers. <b>Challenge:</b> Collect objects to match the numbers e.g. 6 shoes. <b>GEMS</b> Complete the worksheet sorting odd and even numbers. The answer sheet is included so you can check if you were right.</p>	<p><u>Wednesday Maths</u> <b>STARS</b> Log onto to Purple Mash. Type Maths City 1 into the search box. Click on the red rocket at the bottom. Open Maths City and select the farm. Choose the game where the farmer is holding up a number 3. Count carefully. <b>GEMS</b> Google Catch a star odd and even numbers. The moon will say odd or even, move the chimney to catch the odd or even numbers. Careful! The moon changes quite often. After this, teach someone in your family about odd and even numbers. What important things do they need to know?</p>	<p><u>Thursday Maths</u> <b>STARS</b> Find 5 objects. Line them up. Count them and check you have 5. Now see if you can count using ordinal numbers: 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup>. Challenge - find 3 more objects and add them to the line. Repeat the activity. <b>GEMS</b> Find 20 objects - they don't have to be all the same. Line them up and make labels for them, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> ... 20<sup>th</sup>. Ask an adult to ask you to point to the 6<sup>th</sup> or 17<sup>th</sup> object. Now you ask them what is 5<sup>th</sup> in your line and 3<sup>rd</sup>. There is a sheet in the Resources section which you may find useful - Ordinal Numbers.</p>
<p><u>Friday English</u> <b>STARS</b> - Draw a picture of the Troll. Add as much detail as possible. Have a go at writing Troll next to your picture. <b>GEMS</b> - Draw a picture of the Troll. Think of as many adjectives (describing words) as you can to describe the Troll. Think about what the Troll looks like and his personality. Write down the adjectives around the picture.</p>	<p><u>Friday Maths</u> <b>STARS</b> Count out 5 objects. Now find one more. How many now? Complete the activity for STARS Friday Maths. <b>GEMS</b> You need the sheet Ordinal Numbers for today's work. Learn how to read and write the ordinal numbers written as numbers and words. Ask an adult to test you. Play your favourite odd and even game again.</p>	<p><u>Afternoons:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Look at your Class Home Learning Grid.
