<p>Quickly say each of the sounds on the Sounds Chart; change the order each time. If you know the sounds in set 1 try set 2.</p>	<p>Watch Numberblocks- https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=vO2bD4UHwnk Can you find double? When you see two that are the same pause the video and add them together. Can you write down the different doubles you find? Record them as a number sentence- '5+5=10'.</p>	<p>With your grown-up pour some water into a cup. Place the cup into a freezer. The next day look at your cup. What has happened? Discuss the changes. Talk about what happens to puddles in the winter when it's really cold.</p>
<p>Can you dress yourself? Can you turn your sleeves the right way? Can you do up your own zip?</p>	<p>Using the ladybird doubling sheet draw spots to match the other side. Add them together and write your number sentences.</p>	<p>Discuss how it feels in winter and which items of clothing we should wear to stay warm. Draw a picture of yourself in winter clothes. Can you label the different items?</p>
<p>Keep a diary of what you have done each day. Can you draw pictures and write some words or captions.</p>	<p>Cut out the doubling ducks and mix them up. Can you match them to find all of the doubles?</p>	<p>Use Moonpen to draw a picture of a penguin- https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3SGy-xPt5tA</p>
<p>Practise reading the green words. If you can read the words with set 1 sounds try to read the set 2 words.</p>	<p>Using the llama doubling sheet, double their food. Can you write a number sentence for each calculation underneath?</p>	<p>Look outside. Can you spot any signs of winter? Can you find anything on the winter checklist?</p>
<p>Practice counting from 1 to 20.</p>	<p>Using the interactive dice on- https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9L-VhUmir-A Pause the video, how many spots are on your dice? Draw that amount and double. How many do you have altogether? Repeat and write the number sentence for each double that you find.</p>	
<p>Practise writing your numbers to 20 using the number rhymes to help you.</p>		
<p>Sing some of your favourite nursery rhymes and songs.</p>

<p>Choose 3 sounds you don't know from set 1 or 2. See if you can learn the sounds and practise writing them. Use the letter rhymes to help you form them correctly.</p>	<p>Listen to your grown up read the model text (The Gingerbread Man). See if you can learn it bit by bit over the next few weeks. Join in with any parts you know.</p>	<p>Purple Mash- can you paint a winter themed picture and talk about it?</p>
<p>Try and learn our new red words. Use the sheet to help you write them.</p>	<p>Can you write a simple sentence of what the gingerbread man may have said? E.g. 'please don't eat me', 'you can't catch me' 'I am good at running'. Remember the words do not need to be spelt correctly. Just write the sounds you can hear in each word.</p>	<p>Purple Mash- can you design and label the different items of clothing?</p>
