<p><u>Monday English</u> https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-songs-index/zhwdgwx Choose a different Nursery Rhyme. Try to learn it and then perform it to your family.</p>	<p><u>Tuesday English</u> Say / sign or write down the words that rhyme from the game that you played. E.g. if you were reciting Humpty Dumpty the rhyming words are: wall, fall, men, again. What do you notice about where these words were in the rhyme?</p>	<p><u>Wednesday English</u> Make a zig-zag book about your favourite Nursery Rhyme. Break it down into small parts and draw a picture about each part. Use your book to help you learn the rhyme.</p>	<p><u>Thursday English</u> Play this game with an adult or older sibling: Ask them to say the first line of a Nursery Rhyme - your job is to say the second line. Then they say the third line and you say the fourth line etc.</p>
<p><u>Monday Maths</u> We are using our Nursery Rhyme work to help us learn new things in Maths! We are going to learn about position and location using prepositions. Here are some examples of prepositions: next to, behind, under, on top of. Ask an adult to call out one of the prepositions and make your teddy move behind the sofa, next to you, on top of the table, under the bed!</p>	<p><u>Tuesday Maths</u> Draw a map showing the route from your front door to your bedroom. Show this to a member of your family. Can they follow the route?</p>	<p><u>Wednesday Maths</u> Ask a member of your family to draw you a map! Try to follow the route shown on the map - where does it begin and end? Try to use the following language - left, right, straight ahead, carry on, turn.</p>	<p><u>Thursday Maths</u> STARS - See if you can help sort everyone's shoes into pairs. GEMS - Sort everyone's shoes into pairs. Have a go at counting in 2's. 2 4 6 8 10 12 14 16 18 20 22 24 26 28 30 Write down the numbers that you say in this sequence.</p>
<p><u>Friday English</u> STARS - Practise writing your name. Ask an adult to write it out for you to trace over. Refer back to the handwriting sheets provided with Grid 3. Start and end each letter in the right place. GEMS - learn how to spell your middle name(s) and surname!</p>	<p><u>Friday Maths</u> STARS - Practise counting from 0-10, Challenge - start learning how to count backwards! Have a go at writing down the numbers. GEMS - Find 20 objects (they don't all have to be the same) Sort them into groups of 10, groups of 5 and groups of 2. What do you notice? Explain to an adult.</p>	<p><u>Afternoons:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Look at your Class Home Learning Grid.
